

BCMUD is a MUD, but what is a MUD?

A Municipal Utility District (MUD) is a type of local governmental entity. Other examples of local governmental entities include counties, cities, school districts, junior colleges, and drainage and flood-control districts.


A MUD is governed by a 5-person board of directors that is elected by the residents within the MUD. The board's primary functions are to oversee the MUD's management, affairs, and operations; establish policies; adopt tax rates; and establish water, sewer, solid waste, and recreational fees and charges.

MUD taxes are levied and collected to finance public infrastructure improvements that serve residents of the District. They also pay for maintenance and operation costs that are not funded by retail rates and charges.

BCMUD's primary functions:

- Own and operate a Public Water Supply (PWS) system that treats and distributes drinking water to residents
- Own and operate a wastewater collection system to provide sewer service to District residents
- Own and operate Managed Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) drainage and stormwater facilities
- Own and operate parks and recreational facilities, including programs for District residents
- Provide street lighting and trash/recycling services

BCMUD About Us



- History: Established in 1977, the District is 47 years old and home to more than 21,000 residents over 4 square miles.
- Utilities: The District has a water intake facility that supplies an 11-mile raw water line, a Superior-rated water treatment/delivery system (60 miles), wastewater conveyance (60 miles), and a Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4).
- Parks and Recreation: The District contains more than 300 acres of parkland with 11 parks, 8 playgrounds, 6 miles of trails, 5 pavilions, 5 basketball courts, 4 pools, a splash pad, 3 tennis courts, 3 volleyball courts, a 65,000-square-foot community center, a Community Garden, greenbelts, 32 Karst Caves, an 18-hole disc golf course, leagues, camps, and extensive programming.
- Customer Service: The District manages street lighting, as well as trash and recycling services.
- Employees: More than 60 full-time, 80 part-time, and 90 seasonal employees work for the District.
- BCMUD does NOT manage roads or sidewalks, nor does it provide fire protection, law enforcement, or electric power.



Park Projects and Improvements FY24 & FY25

Improvement projects are in motion at several District parks.

Parks improvement projects that are underway or in planning include:

- Sendero playscape replacement
- Sendero Springs Pool Improvements
- Cat Hollow Park and Pool improvements
- Shirley McDonald landscaping improvements
- Creekside basketball court resurfacing





TRAIL PROJECTS FY24 & FY25

Trail improvement projects are in motion to increase usability for all and decrease maintenance needs and expenses.

Trails where improvements will be made include:

- Brushy Creek Community Park
- Cat Hollow Park & Disc Golf Course
- Shirley McDonald Park

The District was awarded a Texas Parks and Wildlife Grant that will help pay for trail expansion and connection. Trails that will be improved through this grant include:

- Liberty Walk trail to Great Oaks trailhead expansion (connecting the community to Great Oaks Elementary School)
- Liberty Walk trail to loop to the Community Trail
- O'Connor Trailhead near Beck Preserve expansion and loop





ADA Improvements FY24 & FY25

Improvements pertaining to the Americans with Disabilities Act, or ADA, include:

- Fixed slope at Pepper Rock Park and Community Park parking lots
- Lowering counter at Creekside Pool
- Correcting various trail slopes
- ADA transition plan in development (FY 25)


